Arrowman Service Award



The Order of the Arrow's vision for the future emphasizes a strategy of increased service to the Boy Scouts of America by Arrowmen. To reward those Arrowmen who go beyond their immediate responsibilities to help and guide others to new heights, the Order of the Arrow created the Arrowman Service Award. The award will focus on three areas of service: personal, chapter/lodge activities, and general service to the community.

The timeline of the award will begin on January 1, 2001, and will end on December 31, 2003. The award may be earned in the year 2001, 2002, and 2003. All first time recipients may purchase the original award (the white ribbon with the gold compass). Arrowmen who earn the award more than once during the outlined three year period (2001-2003) may purchase the silver attachment for having completed this award a second time (2002 or 2003 only) and the bronze attachment for having completed this award a third time (2003 only). The attachment will be worn on the award's white ribbon. Signatures of approval will be required for each requirement.

The design selected will be the arrowhead with the compass rose. The compass rose symbolizes direction; the path ahead for one's travel. Since our strategic plan also offers direction for the Order's future, the compass rose is appropriately super-imposed over the arrowhead. A solid white ribbon, representing the new direction for the Order, is most appropriate. A wallet size certificate is issued with each award.



Chenille on Its Way

For the second time in its history, Orca Lodge will issue a chenille (for those who aren't patch aficionados, a chenille is basically a fuzzy, collector's-item patch), to be released at this year's Lodge Dinner in November. The design, modeled loosely after the 2000 Area 3 Triclave patch was designed by **Steve Marshall** and features a northcoast indian design utilizing a red, blue black and white color scheme.



The price for a single chenille is \$25. Each subsequent chenille costs \$50. Be sure to mail the enclosed registration form to the Santa Rosa Council Office in order to ensure that you will receive a chenille. Order forms will be accepted until September 1. Because the lodge will only order as many chenilles as are pre-ordered, there will not be an opportunity to purchase additional ones at a later date. 


