## Samoa Cookhouse

### Site of the 2002 Lodge Dinner



The historic Samoa Cookhouse will be the site of the Ninth Annual Lodge Dinner, to be hosted by *Mow-A-Toc Chapter* on **Saturday, November 9**. The Cookhouse is located in Samoa, a short drive west of Eureka (see directions elsewhere). The cookhouse was also the site of the 1996 and 2000 lodge dinners. The dinner will begin at 5 p.m. with a social hour and fellowship. Immediately following will be the dinner which features Soup of the Day, Salad, Roast Beef or Lemon Pepper Chicken, Baked Potato, Vegetable, Dessert, and all washed down with plenty of coffee. After the meal, lodge elections, awards and entertain-



ment will commence. The dinner should last until about 8:30 p.m. A Lodge Executive Board meeting will be held at 1 p.m. at the Eureka Council Service Center before the dinner.

The cost for this memorable and fun-filled night is only \$25 for arrowmen, which includes your dinner and 2003 dues, \$15 for over 12 years of age to adults, \$7.00 for ages 8-11, \$4.00 for ages 5-7 and free if 4 years of age or under. Remember that this is not an exclusive lodge event. Feel free to bring family and friends.

Be sure to fill out the registration form and return it to the Eureka Council Office no later than Friday, November 1. Hope to see everyone there.

The Vigil dinner and ceremonies will be held on the weekend of December 14-15 at Camp Masonite Navarro.

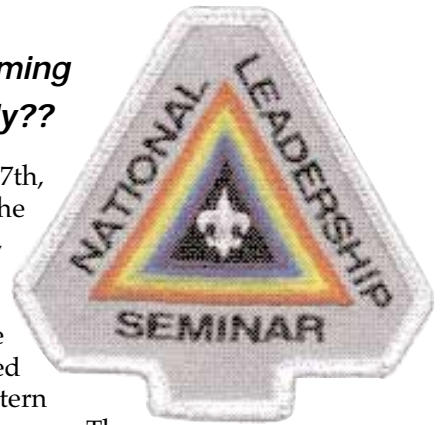

## NLS is coming Are YOU Ready??

On November 15-17th, 2002 Area 3 of the Western Region, Order of the Arrow will hold its NLS in Pleasanton, CA. The seminars are conducted in our area of the Western



Region every other year. The focus will be on the skills and attributes of leadership. They are intended to enhance the leadership skills of the Order of the Arrow's key youth and adult members as we seek to improve our service to the Boy Scouts of America and the greater community.

The seminar will provide participants with a better understanding of the skills of leadership and how to apply them to themselves and other people. Participants are shown that with practice and work, leadership skills can improve. They will develop and understanding that different situations require the applications of different skills. Over the course of the weekend they will come to the realization that leadership skills work in tandem with one another, rather than in isolation and apart from one another. ## Arrowman Service Award



The *Arrowman Service Award* was introduced by the National Committee in 2000 to emphasize the ideal of service, not only to the lodge, but also to the community. The award is available from January 1, 2001 to December 31, 2003.

The award is a red arrow with a gold compass emblazoned on it, suspended from a white ribbon. It is worn like the Universal Ribbon. The award can be earned up to three times in this timespan. Each time it is earned, a different color compass is placed on it. The second time is a Bronze compass; the third time is a silver one.

# Conclave 2002 Blasts Off

## Bringing Brotherhood to a Peak at Lake Tahoe

On the weekend of September 13-15, more than 300 arrowmen converged at Diamond Peak Ski Resort, on the shores of beautiful Lake Tahoe, for a weekend of Fun and Fellowship.

The Conclave got off to a good start on Friday night, with a Poker Run and Council of Chiefs Meeting. The next day featured training, a service project, and the Section Elections.

The Netami Wulet University made a return this year, after a successful run the 2001 Conclave in Redding. Many different courses were available. They were grouped into five "colleges", including: Leadership and Management, History, Communications, Advising, and American Indian Studies. Bachelor's Degrees were available for those continuing in their chosen field.

The service project was spreading pine needles over a ski run, to prevent erosion. It was hot and dusty work, but worthwhile, since it will give grass seed time to grow, which will prevent runoff. The Midway was a great success. It had a demonstration on fires put on by the CDF, a Dunk Tank, and booths from all the lodges in the section.

Yowlumne Lodge (#303) was added to Section W3B during the past year. The Lodge, which recently celebrated its 55th anniversary, has a long and rich history.
