Lodge elections will be held at the dinner. All arrowmen under the age of 20 are eligible to run for office. The positions are Chief, Vice-Chief, Secretary, and Treasurer.



If you are interested in running, contact a lodge or chapter officer. Nominations open at the Lodge Executive Committee meeting preceding the dinner.

Tap-outs for the Vigil Honor occur at the Lodge Dinner, along with the presentation of the Founder's Award. Also awarded at the Lodge Dinner are the coveted Orca Lodge Silver Flukes and the prestigious James E. West Award.

This year the lodge will hold a fund raising memorabilia auction at the dinner. Anyone willing to donate patches to the cause is welcome, comma check your sock drawer for that old patch. The dinner should last until about 8:30 p.m. Be sure to fill out the registration form and return it to the Eureka Council Office no later than November 3rd. Hope to see everyone there.

Arrowmen, dues for the 2007 year are being collected. Dues for this year are only \$10.00 if you want to have newsletters *emailed* to you. If you want newsletters mailed via snail mail, your dues are \$15.00 (to cover printing, postage and handling). Both fees include at least 4 issues of Orca Spouts throughout the year (either via email or snail mail depending on amount of dues paid), as well as a shiny, new membership card. Please note, you do not have to pay back dues if you haven't paid in several years. It also entitles you to participate in all lodge activities this year. If you have not paid your dues, fill out the attached form, with your check, and mail it to the Eureka council office (if you attended the lodge dinner, you have already paid dues for 2006). Arrowmen who have not paid their dues by March 1, 2007 will be dropped from the list of active members. Because of the costs involved with creating, printing and mailing the newsletter, coupled with the costs that the lodge pays to recharter inactive members, Orca Lodge can no longer afford to keep inactive members on the mailing list. If you wish to continue receiving the newsletter, and retain your membership, it is imperative that the attached form be completed and sent to the council office with a check.

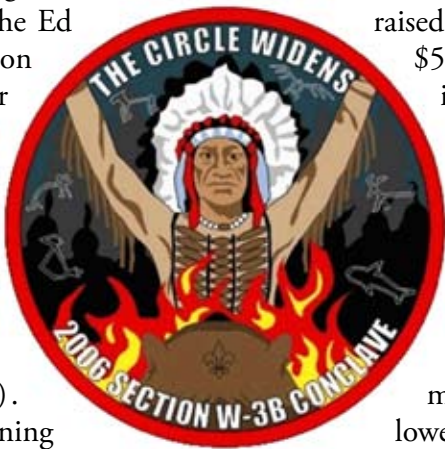
In a new twist, the Vigil Dinner consisted of all the Vigils serving all other members dinner... complete with waiters towels. Wow!
