
James E. West Fellowships were awarded to **Bruce Mayfield** and **Steve Marshall**.

A rrowmen, dues for the 2008 year are being collected. Dues for this year are only \$15.00 if you want to have newsletters *emailed* to you. If you want newsletters mailed via snail mail, your dues are \$20.00 (to cover printing, postage and handling). 
