

ArrowCorps5 - A Legacy in Service

rrowmen from around the World descended on the Mt. Shasta Ski Park on Saturday, July 12 for a week of service in the Shasta-Trinity National Forest. Orca Lodge sent a good sized contingent plus several staff members. It was estimated that the OA completed something in the neighborhood of 12-15 years of normal maintenance in our 4 days of actual trail time. Parts of many trails were literally missing, and Arrowmen and Women did major trail clean up and repair throughout the area. In addition, the lookout at Little Hoffman Peak was rebuilt, several outhouses refurbished, and tons of trash (washing machines, refrigerators, cars and more) were removed from the forest.

To insure that work was done correctly, The OA created the Instructor Corps especially for this event. The ICorps provided the needed experience to teach and lead the crews assigned to all the trails that were worked on at the Shasta-Trinity site. In addition to work, they provided program throughout the event. The ICorps members were a dedicated group of young men from around the country. Those I worked with on the Sisson-Callahan Trail confirmed my faith in the future of Scouting, the OA, and our country.

After spending Saturday the 12th with contingents arriving by car, plane, and bus, everyone was assigned to a crew and then attended required safety training. The crews then setup their camp sites for the night. Sunday morning saw the first crews leave around 8:00 AM. It was a great sight watching all the white "Passenger-vans" pull away with excited Arrowmen ready to do their part. Logistics and transportation

of the 400 plus people out to all the trail heads was a day-long process. Sunday night starting around 6:00 PM saw the first of the nightly reports from the crews and back country supervisors. These reports were eagerly

awaited by all participants and staff as they were usually filled with great reports on trail work, bear sightings and even issues with spider pigs

Thursday was a wild day for Shasta-Trinity. First, President George Bush arrived in Redding to review the fire damage in the area and also presented National Chief Jake Wellman, Western Region Chief Mark Hendricks and Youth Deputy Incident Commander Alex

Braden with Presidential Volunteer Service Awards. Governor Schwarzenegger was also on hand to thank the Order of the Arrow for the service we are giving the National Forests across the country this summer.

Thursday was also the day to "extract" all of our crews from the field. Pickups were originally scheduled to start at 9AM, but so many of the crews requested more time to complete work on their trails that it was delayed until about 2 in the afternoon with the last crew (6) from the Pacific Crest Trail arriving in camp about 9:45 PM. Even after 4

days of trail work, all crews arrived back with smiles on their faces, excited about what they had accomplished and thinking about how they could continue this project's legacy in their own Lodges and Sections in the future.

Friday was "recreation day" for all participants. Thank goodness everyone was able to shower before then. Recreation included everything from driving to Lassen National Park to hike Lassen Peak; golf at the Mt. Shasta Country Club, caving near Lake Shasta and also an afternoon beach party at Lake Siskiyou. Friday night was capped by a closing show which included a video highlighting the week, presentations to the Incident Command staff, a short speech by OA Chairman Brad Haddock; and finished with a video reminding us of the legacy we all have the opportunity to provide for our world.


The End of an Era



After 35 years, this year's Conclave will be the last W3B Conclave we will see. The Western Region is redrawing its area boundaries and, as a result, the section boundaries and designations will be changing as well. This Change will officially happen Jan. 1 2009. The final boundaries have been announced, and it is certain that this will be our last Conclave as Section W3B. The last time the region underwent a reorganization of this scale was 1972.


Prior to 1972, sections as we know them today were non-existent. The country was divided into twelve regions rather than the four we have now, and Conclaves were held on an area level. In 1972, areas 12C and 12D were merged to form the new Section W3B, with the first W3B Conclave being held in 1973 at the College of the Redwoods in Eureka, CA. Since then the Section has seen its share of change. Of the original ten Lodges, only one remains today. The other nine merged in the 90's to form four new Lodges. Then in the last few years we gained two more Lodges from smaller area realignments.

With the final Conclave of W3B, only a little more than a month away, don't miss out on what is sure to be an exciting end to an era. Come and be
